## 1. Subjunctive voice;

In spite of this, there are obvious benefits to having / of teachers in the classroom. For one thing, in addition to/beyond (except) imparting knowledge, teachers at school can take care of students' mental health. As they are in close contact with friends every day, teachers can pay attention to what children think, and they can also give some practical advice about/on their growth in all aspects.

For another, online teachers cannot teach students face\_to\_face. As a result, they cannot supervise students properly. When some students are too lazy to finish their homework, their online teacher may not know that. Consequently, in the long term, some students may not finish their homework on time resulting in (and get) terrible academic performance.

In (To reach the) conclusion, although <u>online</u> learning/( on) computer<u>learning/learning</u> <u>on a computer</u> benefits people a lot, it <u>should</u> (would) not/could not/cannot/never will replace traditional teachers in the classroom.
